

Pediatric Early Warning System: Implementing the Tool: Who, What, When and Why

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PURPOSE: Upon completion of this activity, the learner will be able to identify and understand the use of the tool and implement within their practice to improve pediatric care and prevent poor outcomes. It will allow the caregiver to know when to call MD or for family practice provider to understand the tool and when to call for assistance on management of the pediatric patient.

Review PEWS scoring using Monaghan's tool as a clinical tool in assessing patient's risk for deterioration.
