

eCare Senior Care: Urinary Tract Infections

Purpose: Urinary tract infections, or UTIs, often have subtle signs in the elderly and compromised populations. This course will review UTI signs and symptoms, early recognition, management strategies and preventative measures.

Objectives:

- 1 Differentiate asymptomatic bacteriuria versus urinary tract infection (UTI).
- 2 Identify appropriate initial antibiotic to start with when suspecting UTI.
- 3 Recognize duration of antibiotic therapy for both simple and complicated UTI.
- 4 Discuss strategies for prevention of UTIs.

Outcome: Demonstrate knowledge of early recognition and intervention in UTIs and prevention tactics by passing post-test with score of $\geq 80\%$.
