

# eCare: The Role of Nurses in Rapid Sequence Intubation RSI

## Program Goal

Rapid sequence intubation (RSI) is an airway management technique that produces inducing immediate unresponsiveness (induction agent) and muscular relaxation (neuromuscular blocking agent) and is the fastest and most effective means of controlling the emergency airway

## Objectives

- 1 Familiarize: Medications Used for RSI and RSI Procedure
- 2 Recognize: RSI – When and When Not to Perform
- 3 Anticipate: Back-up Plan, Murphy's Law

## Outcome

100 % of participants will demonstrate knowledge of RSI by passing post-test with score of  $\geq 80\%$  by completion of the education.
