Pediatric Management Heated High Flow

Program Goal

Healthcare teams in critical access facilities are utilizing heated high flow oxygen devices for the pediatric population in situations that would have otherwise required intubation or CPAP. This course will discuss what is heated high flow, what are the indications of heated high flow for the pediatric population, how to initiation heated high flow, how to monitor the patients on heated high flow, and how to wean pediatric patients on heated high flow.
